Honoring Nancy's Memory through NFHFoundation

The Nancy Floyd Haworth Foundation is a breast cancer educational and support organization. It was established in 1990 by Dr. Vaun and Mary Floyd as a memorial to their daughter Nancy, who died at age 42 of breast cancer.

Originally named the Nancy Floyd Haworth Memorial Breast Cancer Lectureship and Luncheon Committee, the newly named NANCY FLOYD HAWORTH FOUNDATION (NFHF) became an independent non-profit foundation in 2006.

Many NFHF projects during these years have provided assistance for:

- * Free breast cancer public seminars
- * Funds for mammograms for the underserved and uninsured
- * Breast cancer resource materials in many New Mexico public and some Native American libraries
- * Support services for patients in treatment
- * Collaborative assistance for the purchase of a linear accelerator and several Komen Foundation grants for local breast cancer projects
- * Grant funds awarded annually to New Mexico organizations for projects supporting the NFHF mission



Community support has been generous and has assured the continuing success of NFHF to education and support New Mexicans about breast cancer.

Tanoan Golf Tourney

Tanoan Women's Golf Association spearheaded a yearlong campaign to raise funds and breast cancer awareness in conjunction with the entire Tanoan Country Club membership. The Men's Golf Association held a 'closest to the pin' contest during one of their major tournaments and contributed the proceeds to the cause. The Couples Golf Association sold 'mulligans' and made that donation to the coffers. The Club sponsored a Pink Martini Night to help raise awareness and to kick off the gigantic basket raffle where over forty themed baskets were presented. The Niners women donated numerous baskets and supported the cause all year with their time and talent.

In August almost one hundred women participated in the Rally for the Cure golf tournament. Signs honoring a "survivor" friend or family member as well as memorials for cancer victims could be purchased. More than forty signs dotted the tee boxes at Tanoan during the tournament.

Pink shirts, which were originally a means of raising money, became a symbol of support for the cause. Both men and women golfers, along with the Pro Shop staff and General Manager, Bill Gaspard, were regularly seen sporting their pink finery.

The events sponsored by Tanoan Country Club and its members not only succeeded in raising breast cancer awareness but enabled the group to far surpass the original goal of raising ten thousand dollars. TWGA proudly presented checks to NFHF, the Anita Salas Memorial Fund, and the Susan G. Komen Rally for the Cure organization.

First Annual "Bosom Buddy" Golf/Tournament Held

On October 13th, 2009, the first annual Bosom Buddy Golf Tournament to benefit the Nancy Floyd Haworth Foundation was sponsored and held at the Albuquerque Country Club. Library Project

During 2009, the Nancy Floyd Haworth Foundation awarded grants of \$277 to nine public libraries in New Mexico. These funds were designated for the purchase of materials on breast cancer. Only communities with a population of less than 30,000 were eligible to apply for the grants. "We wanted to reach the smaller libraries and communities in our state," noted Allene Kleweno, chair of the NFHF Library Project Committee.

Grants were awarded to public libraries in Artesia, Eunice, Los Lunas, Los Alamos, Portales, Questa, Silver City, Tularosa, and Jal. The NFHF Library Project Committee collaborated with the New Mexico Library Foundation who handled all of the administrative work.

Allene reports very positive responses from all of the libraries. The librarian in Los Lunas wrote, "I would like to thank you for making this grant available. It has helped us tremendously in providing the best material available on breast cancer." Many librarians made special displays of the books that were purchased. Some of them also gave interviews and provided information for local radio public service announcements.

The NFHF committee is working on a library project for 2010. Allene said, "We believe that working with New Mexico libraries goes along with the NFHF mission of providing information to the public about breast cancer."

Other committee members serving with Allene are Cori Simms Ewing and Joanne Kimmey.
